Dear Superintendent:

I am writing to advise you of the Michigan Department of Education's (MDE) 2023 determination under section 616 of the *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act* (IDEA). The MDE has determined that Sample ISD Name Meets Requirements in implementing the purposes and requirements of Part B of the IDEA. This determination is based on the totality of the Intermediate School District's (ISD) data and information, including the Federal fiscal year (FFY) 2021 State Performance Plan/Annual Performance Report (SPP/APR), other federally reported data, as well as other ISD-reported data.

The ISD's 2023 determination is based on the data reflected in the ISD's "2023 MDE Part B Results-Driven Accountability Matrix" (MDE-RDA Matrix). The RDA Matrix is individualized for each ISD and consists of:

- Results Matrix that includes scoring on Results Elements.
- Compliance Matrix that includes scoring on Compliance Indicators and other compliance factors.
- Results Score and a Compliance Score.
- RDA Percentage based on both the Results Score and Compliance Score.
- ISD's Determination.

The MDE-RDA Matrix and data are more fully explained in the document, entitled "How the Michigan Department of Education Made Determinations under Section 616(d) of the *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act* in 2023: Part B."

The MDE is continuing to use both results data and compliance data in making determinations in 2023. In making Part B determinations in 2023, the MDE used results data related to:

- English Language Arts (ELA) and Math participation and proficiency of students with individualized education programs (IEPs) on any Statewide assessment at fourth and eighth grades.
- Percentage of students with IEPs who graduated with a regular high school diploma.

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- Percentage of students with IEPs who dropped out.

The MDE used compliance data related to:

- Suspension and Expulsion of students with IEPs.
- Disproportionate Representation in Special Education of students with IEPs due to inappropriate identification.
- Disproportionate Representation of students with IEPs in Specific Disability Categories due to inappropriate identification.
- Timely initial evaluations.
- Timeliness of Part C to Part B Transition.
- Secondary Transition of students with IEPs.
- Timeliness of IDEA Data Reported through the Michigan Student Data System.
- Special Education Single Audit Findings.
- Longstanding Noncompliance.

The MDE is pleased to inform you that your ISD data for results and compliance data meet the purposes and requirements of section 616(b) as described in the above reference document - "How the Michigan Department of Education Made Determinations under Section 616(d) of the *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act* in 2023: Part B." Even as the ISD meets the purposes and requirements of the IDEA for 2023, there continues to be a need for improvement in individual districts in the ISD.
